The journal's readers will go on counting on a section dedicated to Implantology, which will address its characteristics and techniques in a more consistent and scientific-based manner, while seeking the best clinical and scientific quality possible.

of Implantology, we will carry on giving our contribution, so that the new editor-in-chief, Prof. Dr. Oswaldo Scopin, is able to take this new publication to the highest levels nationally and internationally. Renowned researches of national and international importance, working in the fields of Esthetics, Periodontology, Prosthesis, Surgery and Implantology, will give their contribution, which will certainly result in a more modern, consistent journal of great clinical and scientific value.

We will seek a consistent clinical and scientific approach, while gathering forces onward.
